Ready to Serve - Matthew 9:35-38

Question: What does it take to do servant evangelism?

The Point: It takes a willing spirit and a broken heart.

[35] And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. [36] When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. [37] Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; [38] therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."
(Matthew 9:35-38 ESV)

1. Go to the people

[9:35] And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages,
